The symptoms were progressing and over the past 3 days the patient stated that he was short of breath lying down.</p> <p>Upon arrival, the EMT finds the patient was confused but able to speak in short phrases. Initial vital signs are: BP 90/60, pulse – 130 beats/min, Respiratory rate 28 and labored, O2 saturation 80% on room air and blood glucose of 250mg/dl. EMT applied oxygen and observed that the patient's oxygenation and work of breathing improve markedly with 100% O2 by non-rebreather face mask. Physical examination is remarkable for increased work of breathing with rhonchi found bilaterally at the lung bases (worse on the left). The patient's medical problems include Diabetes for last 25 years and a known case of asthma.</p>
Prehospital Care Provided	<p>His son states that he'd been having increased difficulty breathing over the past 24 hours accompanied by a mild cough and confusion. The patient himself told the EMT he hasn't had a fever or chest pain, and he's unsure if he's taken all of his medications over the past few days. EMT sought the help of emergency physician online and followed the standard treatments for respiratory distress as per his advice which include oxygen, nebulization, Intravenous fluids and continuous monitoring of the patient's vital signs and the adequacy of the patient's ventilatory status. The patient is transported to the nearest hospital for further evaluation and treatment.</p>

Case Details	<p>Thirty persons were injured when a fire broke out during a festival at kalamman temple in Rangasamudaram in pudurnadu in Tirupattur taluk. The incident occurred due to the powder meant for making crackers and kerosene were kept in close proximity inside the temple.</p> <p>Some of the volunteers involved in bursting crackers during the festival and also prepared crackers using the powder. The fire broke out in a splash when kerosene accidentally fell on the cracker powder.</p> <p>Though there were two exit points in the temple for the crowd to escape, 30 persons sustained burns because of the heavy crowd. 108 team received the call at around 12.25 pm to report the incident and requested for immediate help. The Pudurnadu ambulance received the dispatch information and responded to the scene immediately within 10 minutes.</p> <p>After reaching the scene EMT and Pilot informed the program manager requesting additional support as there were more than thirty people sustained burn injuries. EMT Vijayakumar quickly performed triaging at scene and identified two victims Mr. Perumal and Mrs. Rengammal who were critically injured and transported them promptly into the ambulance.</p>
Prehospital Care Provided	<p>EMT administered oxygen to Mr. Perumal via Non re-breather mask. He then applied dry sterile dressing and placed an Intravenous access to both the victims.</p> <p>Both the victims were treated with appropriate care and got shifted to Tirupattur Government Hospital. In the mean time all other victims those who reached Pudurnadu PHC which is nearer to the incident site got treated and referred to Tirupattur Government Hospital from where 10 were referred to the Government hospital, Kilpauk using 108 ambulances from various locations of Vellore district - Katpadi, Perambut, Natrampalli, Alankayam, Tirupattur, Ambur and Burgur ambulances.</p> <p>Thus 108 services once again proved its efficiency to respond to multi casualty incidents in a successful manner by displaying highest sense of integrity and team work.</p>

Our NEMT received the neonate after pre arrival stabilization. As per NERCP advice, our NEMT inserted naso gastric tube and aspiration was done. Iso-P was administered as a maintaining dose. Frequent suctioning was done. Oxygen 5l was administered. NS- 10ml/kg bolus dose was administered. On enroute vitals were monitored. The vitals were skin color- pale, CFT- &lt;3 secs, T- 37.5C, HR- 152b/m, cry and movements- present, RR- 32b/m, Grunting- present, SpO2- 84% (without oxygen), 99% (with oxygen), DOWNES score- 3/10. The neonate was safely shifted to Govt.Dharmapuri medical college hospital with the stable vital signs.</p>

\*- Ineffective Calls – Calls falling under the category of No Response call , Wrong call , Nuisance, Disconnected call , Missed call , General Enquiry call, and Silent Call are classified as Ineffective calls. These calls land in the call center and when attended by the Communication Officer it would either be a nuisance call or disconnected call or any one of the category as mentioned above.

\*\* - Ambulance Busy – Whenever all the ambulances closer to the area have been assigned for an emergency case, and a new emergency case comes in the same area, the Dispatch Officer will enquire with the caller, if he/she can assign a ambulance from the nearby location. The Dispatch Officer will also tell them about the distance the ambulance has to travel and the approximate time it will take to reach the incident location. If the caller is not willing to wait till the specified time, then the Dispatch officer will close this case as “Ambulance Busy” after confirming with the caller.

\*\*\* - Life Saved count is an update that is received on a daily basis after verification of PCR and confirmation after 48 hour follow-up, there will be a change in the numbers reported as they keep on adding to the earlier reported life save count, based on the date the case was handled by the team.
